# What goes where?



## **NORTH SIDE**

*Watch out for overhead lines! Anything larger than a Toyon will require maintenance to protect the tree and the lines*

## **SOUTH SIDE**


































*Anything goes! If the spot in front of your property is about shady - try the Toyon or Saratoga Laurel, they do better tolerating shade as they grow up.*

## **END OF THE BLOCK**

*There's a bit more space here for the roots to breathe, so you can look into the Chinese Pistache and others with bigger tree well requirements.*
